Dear Scott:

As a follow up to the discussions with the Intergovernmental Cable Communications Authority (I.C.C.A)\* regarding the Royal Oak system upgrade and subsequent conversion to a single cable plant, with this letter I wish to confirm our joint understanding of the plan developed by Comcast to relocate and simplify the PEG channel line-up for all eleven communities. The channel realignment is one of the last steps in eliminating the dual system. Once complete your communities will be able to take full advantage of the 2008 network upgrade, and enjoy greater reliability and improved customer service.

As we have discussed, Comcast will realign the three PEG channels designated for each Consortium community and voluntarily add an additional (or fourth) channel into four consecutive channel locations. This will make local access programming easier to find and eliminate the confusion caused by the blank channels and carryover channels into adjacent communities. In your community, the channel zone(s) are specified below:



Customers will be notified in advance by a letter that describes the upgrade plan and details the local channel realignments. The letter will explain that they will have access to four (4) locally dedicated PEG channels on the Comcast basic lineup, specifically tailored to their channel zone, and identify the new channel positions of each. Comcast will also be publicizing these changes in local media.

As we discussed at our most recent meeting, Comcast engineers are prepared to execute the final conversion to the single system and complete the channel realignment in June 2010.

Thank you for your time and work on this channel realignment and system improvement project; I appreciate your support. I will be in contact with you to discuss the most effective means of publicizing the new channel positions to your communities. If you have additional questions or concerns regarding this matter, please contact me as soon as possible as we plan to send 30-day notices to the cities and customers beginning in May.
